## Cerritos City Council approves 2024-2025 fiscal year budget

The Cerritos City Council/Successor Agency recently approved a \$161.6 million combined financial program for the fiscal year 2024-2025. The budget focuses on providing quality City services while maintaining fiscal responsibility. The new fiscal year began on July 1, 2024 and concludes on June 30, 2025.

Earlier this year, the City Council laid out the priorities for the new fiscal year and targeted key goals to serve as the foundation for the City's future endeavors:

1. Enhance public infrastructure and community aesthetics
2. Boost economic growth and prosperity
3. Enhance effectiveness and efficiencies of public safety programs
4. Increase technology infrastructure/use
5. Increase fiscal transparency

Funding has been allocated specifically to support these five goals.

### Capital Improvements

Approximately \$35.3 million has been allocated toward capital improvement projects. Funds have been earmarked for capital improvement projects related to streets and highways, government buildings, water improvement and other projects focused on the reinvestment in facilities and infrastructure throughout the community.

### Legislative and Administrative

Legislative and Administrative operating expenses outlined in the budget total about \$4.6 million. This reflects the entire amount necessary to fund the ongoing operations of the City Council, City Manager, City Attorney and City Clerk/Treasurer.

### Community Development

The Community Development Department, which includes advance planning, building and safety, current planning and geographic information systems, was allotted approximately \$7.4 million for its operations.

Approximately \$45.7 million has been designated for the Public Works Department, which consists of engineering, traffic circulation management, parks maintenance, sewer maintenance, facility

maintenance, landscaping, trash collection, recycling, custodial services, the City's Water Division and the Cerritos Electric Utility.

### Community and Cultural Services

Formed in Fiscal Year 2024-2025 following the reorganization of the former Department of Community and Safety Services, the Department of Community and Cultural Services develops recreational and social programs and promotes cultural engagement while providing contracted facility rental services. Roughly \$17.2 million has been allocated to the department, which oversees the Office of the Director, Community Participation, Senior Center, Recreation Services and the newly incorporated Municipal Library division.

### Community Safety

The Community Safety Division has been allotted \$23.6 million for law enforcement and code enforcement. The division implements public safety programs and oversees the City's contract with the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

### Administrative Services

An estimated \$16.1 million was approved for the Department of Administrative Services, which includes communications, finance, human resources, management information systems, support services and water billing.

### Theater

The Theater Department was allocated \$11.8 million for the operation of the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA). The Theater Department budget includes theater administration; business management; marketing and management of the CCPA performances; operations and security; special event services; and ticket office personnel.

Copies of the final approved City of Cerritos 2024-2025 Combined Financial Program will be available for public inspection in the office of the City Clerk/Treasurer and on the City's website in August. Opening the show at 8 p.m. is the dynamic Nik West, crowned "the bass icon of this generation" by "Rolling Stone."

F.M. Thomas Air Conditioning, Inc. of Brea was awarded a \$1,134,892 contract to remove the boiler

of the Olympic-sized pool and replace it with a new, more energy-efficient system.

In addition, design engineer consultant IDH Group of Irvine was awarded a \$5,500 contract to provide construction administration and inspection services for the project. ■

## Join Neighborhood Watch

Residents are encouraged to join the Neighborhood Watch in Cerritos, a joint effort by community members and the Cerritos Sheriff's Station/Community Safety Center to fight crime and protect property. One of the oldest crime-prevention programs, it serves as the eyes and ears of the Sheriff's Department and has proven instrumental in keeping communities safe.

Contact the Community Safety Division at (562) 916-1266 to see if a Neighborhood Watch group has been formed in your neighborhood. If there is an established group, you will be provided with the name and phone number of the Watch Captain.

If there is no active group yet in your area, the Community Safety Division will help you and your neighbors start one. Ideal Neighborhood Watch groups are typically small – usually 15 to 20 households – to simplify communication among participants. A designated block captain will be responsible for acting as the liaison between a neighborhood and the Cerritos Sheriff's Station/Community Safety Center.

While the Community Safety Division and Sheriff's Department will assist in many ways, the success of Neighborhood Watch depends largely on resident involvement. Participants will receive Neighborhood Watch signs to post, alerting potential criminals that others are watching out for your home. Members of the watch group monitor their neighborhoods, communicate regularly with deputies and meet with neighbors routinely to stay current on crime trends and information. If a residential crime pattern is identified in the area, deputies will notify the group of what to look out for and suggest prevention strategies.
